I FIRST STARTED WORK WITH THEESB IN FEBRUARY 1959 FOR 4 MONTHS FOR ES AWEEK AND WORKED & DAY SATURDAY DOING SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS AROUND THE HOSPITAL, CREAMERY, AND COTTAGES, I REMEMBER THE DAY JACK HARTE CAME FROM EAST THE ROAD ON his MOTOR BIKE WITH BELT PLIERS AND CLIMBERS TO START WORK IN CASTLETOWN FOR ABOUT SYED MICKIE OROURKE CAME FOR A SHORT TIME AFTERWARDS, PAT SMITH RIP, CAME IN 63 UNTIL 66 AND ON TO NEW CASTLEWEST FOR THE REMAINDER OF HIS LIFE, THEN CAME JOHN MURPHY FROM BANDON FOLOWED BY SEAN CONNOLY FROM DURRUS, THEN FRANCIS LEHANE FROM BALLYDONECAN IN 1972 UNTIL HIS RETIRMENT, FOLLOWED BY THE PRESEST MAN MIKE CAHIL FROM KILLARNEY.
