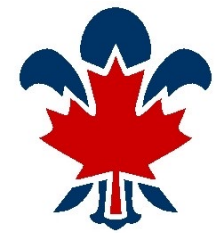


Scientific reasons to attend IBC2006, even if not ‘presenting’

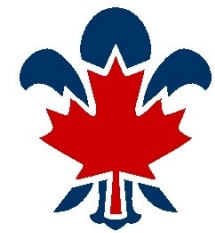

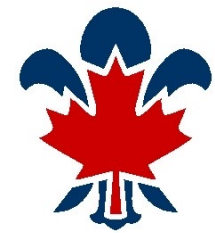
IBC Tradition... Mon-Tue & Thu-Fri : Scientific
